KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL CELEBRATES 110TH ANNIVERSARY

Kiwanis International turns 110 on January 21, 2025!

Kiwanis International was founded in 1915 in Detroit, Michigan, U.S. The organization was originally called the "**Supreme Lodge Benevolent Order of Brothers**". A year later, the name changed to **Kiwanis**, which was selected by the organization's founders (Joseph C. Prance and Allen S. Browne) based on their understanding that the word was translatable to "**we build**" from the Algonquian Native American language family. That same year, Kiwanis became an international organization with the founding of the Kiwanis Club of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.



MEET PKIT PIERRE LALIBERTÉ

Pierre Laliberté, a Chartered Life Underwriter, joined Kiwanis International as a member of the Kiwanis Club of Québec in December 1981 and served as Secretary (1983-1985) and



President (1985-86). Pierre was the Lieutenant Governor of Division 16-Alouette under Governor Glen Bagnell in 1986-1987 and was Governor-Elect of the Eastern Canada and the Caribbean District (ECC) in 1989-1990 and Governor 1990-1991. Member of the Kiwanis Club of Sillery/Sainte-Foy/Cap-Rouge from October 1, 1991, until it closed, Pierre Laliberté served as club President from 1995-96. In May 2022, he received the Kiwanis International Legion of Honor Award for 40 Years of Service.

Since 1985, Pierre has attended most of the ECC District Conventions until the 2019 District Convention in Stratford, Ontario. He has most recently attended the 2023 District Convention in Quebec City, Canada. He attended many Kiwanis International Conventions from 1987 to 2006. Pierre Laliberté served as Kiwanis International Trustee (KIT) from 2003 to 2006, having been elected at the 2002 District Convention in Ottawa.

On invitation, Pierre Laliberté joined the CHUL (Centre hospitalier de l'Université Laval) Foundation's Board from 1988 to 1993. {"In the Ste-Foy borough, the teams at the CHUL and the Centre mère-enfant Soleil (CMES) provide specialized care, particularly in maternal and childcare, digestive diseases, chronic pain and medically assisted procreation."}

At the Chicoutimi District Convention in August 1988, Pierre sponsored a major amendment to the district's bylaws. Since then, English and French have been the official languages in the district.

Past Kiwanis International Trustee (PKIT) Pierre has provided translation from English to French and French to English for all official documents in the ECC District Office for many years. Pierre tackles this large task with enthusiasm, professionalism and speed. He translates emails, notices, instructions, training

material, Bylaws and Policies. The district seldom waits more than a day or two for the turnaround. His stipend is reasonable, and having Pierre on the team has saved the district thousands of dollars.

Since 2010, he represented Kiwanis on the board of La Maison des Grands-parents de Sainte Foy (Grandparent's House), where grandparents help children between 7 and 15 years old with their homework. They are also introduced to woodwork and electricity. Grandparents are also involved in literacy: they visit some 15 primary schools and read stories. This year, grandparents are involved in French immersion for immigrants living in the area. There are now six groups with one grandparent for three individuals.

Pierre has been described as "patient and understanding, accurate but flexible. His great sense of humour is revealed in the jokes he regularly sends via email. If you should look gentleman up in the dictionary... Pierre will be there somewhere". When asked about his other interests outside of Kiwanis Service, PKIT Pierre responded: "I've never been interested in playing any other sport than hockey as an amateur; my abilities were not there. If you were to give me a hammer or a screwdriver, you would understand what I mean. I love attending matches, i.e., hockey and baseball. I truly enjoyed wild trout fishing, camping, traveling in Europe, and cruising in the Caribbean. One day, we docked in Ocho Rios, and I visited Evita at her restaurant. We visited many friends with her, and she drove me back to the dock to the surprise of many."

Being close to 88 years old, PKIT Pierre leads a quieter life. Pierre enjoys being involved in community activities and service. Sometimes, he attends a club meeting and enjoys being at a Division Council Meeting (DCM). He also enjoys translating material for Kiwanis, and he hopes to be able to do this for more years to come.

- 1. **The existing private group Kiwanis ECC, will remain** where Kiwanians must request to join the group, and any Kiwanian can post. Kiwanians will need to answer all the questions in order to join so we can verify that all persons joining are Kiwanians and agree to the rules.
- 2. The existing profile ECC District, will be closed soon.
- 3. A new page Kiwanis ECC, has been created, and anyone can follow the page. Only administrators (members of the district team) will be able to post on this page.


